Minutes of the Classical Association of Florida Saturday, November 22, 2008 Dolphin Hotel, Walt DisneyWorld Resort

President Geoffrey Revard called the meeting to order at 7:02 P.M. There were fifteen members present. The names of those in attendance can be found as an attachment to the minutes. Geoff welcomed all to the ACTFL/FFLA annual meeting and said that he hoped the membership found the convention good. He announced that both he and Sandra Enscoe were on the program Sunday, November 23.

As part of the president's report Geoff announced that the constitution is not quite "back together" but will be recomposed by the April meeting. Geoff suggested that there are three more items to be considered: 1) the duties of the state chair 2) the term of office of the CAF president 3) a recommendation to elect the president in the fall in order to coordinate the term of office with the FFLA planning meeting in January. Geoff also announced that proposals to the ACL Institute are due on January 12, 2009. The institute will take place June 26-28, 2009. The state FJCL forum will take place April 16-18, 2009 at the Ramada Orlando Celebration (the old Hyatt).

Vice-President Adam Mize spoke about the state forum. The program is in the works. The ludi packets are in process. The packets will once again arrive electronically in December. The return due date will be March 7, 2009, for both registration and hotel reservations. There will be a spring officers' meeting in Gainesville.

In the absence of Karen Rieffel, Aurelia Ogles gave the treasurer's report. The ending balance as of November 10, 2008, was \$4723.63. There are between 95 and 100 current members of CAF. There is a need to pursue college students for membership.

As for FJCL, Aurelia received \$39,500.30 from Linda Mishkin and Linda Gaskin. After income and expenses amounting to approximately \$60,000, the current balance is \$40, 918. We paid no taxes due to a slight loss. In 2008 many schools were on spring break, a contributing factor to low attendance and nearly having to pay for meeting rooms. This school year only three schools will be on spring break. Hotel rooms will cost \$125 per night.

Minutes were distributed to members at the beginning of the meeting. At this point, Geoff asked for additions or corrections. Marie Girardeau asked for "Mishkin" to be spelled correctly in the body of the minutes and on the attendance sheet. Aurelia Ogles moved to accept the corrections, and Theresa Richardson seconded the motion. The motion passed.

As state chair, Marie Girardeau, announced that there were two buses to this year's NJCL convention at Miami University. The total delegation was 130, a bit smaller than in the past, perhaps due to the cost of the packet (\$400). She urged everyone to start planning now for the convention at Cal Davis July 27-Aug. 1, 2009. Marie asked for input about a cultural encounter. She suggested a flight to San Francisco on Friday, July 24, with

sightseeing in San Francisco on Saturday, and a bus trip to Davis on Sunday via the Jelly Belly factory (free tour). The cost would run \$200-225 for this extra experience. Delegates who chose not to be part of the tour could fly to San Francisco or Sacramento. The 2010 convention will once again be in Fargo, North Dakota.

Alan Blessing announced that he extended the scholarship deadline but only had one applicant whose application was not in keeping with the intent of the travel scholarship. The scholarship, therefore, has not been awarded. Discussion ensued about how to deal with the situation. Leslie Perkins suggested that we wait until the next round in two years and simply award two scholarships then. Linda Mishkin suggested that perhaps we award the scholarship next year. Aurelia Ogles moved, since travel prices are currently so attractive, that we extend the deadline to January 15, 2009, and restate the parameters of the scholarship, and if there were still no suitable applicants, we could reconsider the issue at the April meeting. Carol Sue Carlson-Jones seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Geoff reported that in April the office of treasure will be open. Karen Rieffel is finishing her second term in the office. Generally there is a two-term limit. Geoff asked that we consider extending the term of office and that we also consider Karen's employment status in light of our constitution. The office of vice-president will also be open. Aurelia Ogles placed Adam Mize's name in nomination, and Leslie Perkins seconded the nomination to have Adam continue after his replacement term.

Linda Mishkin reported that the student scholarship deadline is in March. She reminded the group that the scholarship is for \$500 and requires the student to take a Classics course in the freshman year. The transcript of the work must be sent to Aurelia Ogles.

Geoff repeated the dates of the FJCL forum. Leslie Perkins asked if eligibility changes for Latin ½ tests were being made. Geoff stated that he did not recommend them nor could changes of that sort be made without CAF approval. The issue will appear on April's agenda. There was discussion about the three Level II tests. We have difficulty getting members to write the tests. There is consideration of writing just one test for both Level II and Advanced, but grading the levels separately. Linda Mishkin suggested that Adam Mize gather some information to present at the April meeting. Adam consented.

Leslie Perkins suggested that chairs who cannot attend meetings submit written reports.

Our Teacher of the Year is Catherine Sturgill.

Geoff announced that Sherwin Little, the ACL President, is encouraging AP teachers to complete the upcoming survey on the state of the exams. If you would like to have the exam author alternate in successive years or have AP redesign the Vergil test to include other authors, please comment, and let your voice be heard. Geoff added that he had written to AP on behalf of CAF and also got FFLA to support our position as well.

Linda Gaskin is quite ill.in the hospital in Jacksonville. Geoff asked us to keep her in our thoughts and prayers.

Our meeting was visited by Peter Howard and Bill Mayer, presenters at ACTFL and active members of the ACL. Bill, who is in his first year as ACL Vice-President, urged us to submit presentations to the ACL Institute in June. The theme is "Nostra Magna Pictura." The pre-conference excursion will go to an exhibit on Pompeii and the Bay of Naples and also to the La Brea Tar Pits. On Saturday participants will go to the Getty villa to eat a box lunch and visit at leisure. In an effort to cut down on textbook publishers' presentations, there will be one session with five fifteen minute presentations from five publishers and then breakout sessions. One of the pre-conference workshops will focus on the challenges new teachers face.

Sandra Enscoe donated many of her teaching materials to the members in attendance.

Theresa Richardson suggested that we consider selling ads to pay for forum. She further suggested that students earn spirit points for selling ads.

Marie Girardeau moved to adjourn the meeting. Alan Blessing seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 8:07 P.M.
